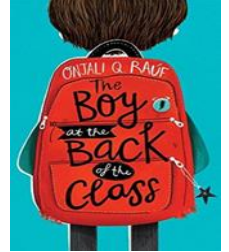


The term ahead: Spring 2 in Year 4

In English we are going to be learning how to write explanatory texts and returning to writing adventure stories, where the children will be working on developing characterisation in their writing through drama and discussion. Our reading text for the term will be “The boy at the back of the class” by Onjali Q Rauf. Our geography and history topic is called ‘Different places, similar lives’, where the children will be learning about our local area and how it has developed over time, before comparing it to another area in the United Kingdom. In maths, the children will be learning about fractions and decimals, including multiplication and division. In Spanish, the children are building on their previous learning of the seasons and will be learning about the weather.
