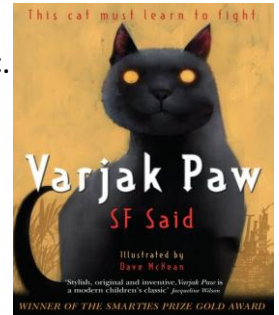


The term ahead: Summer 1 in Year 4
